

## 2015 NATIONAL RAMBOUILLET SHOW & SALE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

\* The State of Minnesota requires a certificate of veterinary inspection, with the premise ID as well as the individual animal scrapie tag number listed on the health certificate for each animal. If you have a different flock tag number, that number needs to be listed as well as an additional means of identification.

\*The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall have the following:

State that the animals described are not showing clinical signs of infectious, contagious, or communicable disease and that they meet movement requirements

State the number of animals in the shipment

State the species, breed, age, and sex of each animal

Document official identification for each animal

Document the address and contact information for the premises of origin and the premises of destination

State the results of any tests that are required by the board

**All rams 6 months of age or older as of July 6, 2015 must have a negative B. ovis test result listed on the CVI, along with a copy of the individual lab test result for each ram entered.**

State the purpose for moving the animals

- Breeding
- Feeding
- Direct to slaughter
- Other (i.e. exhibition/show)

Document a permit number if required

Document any additional information required by the board

Sheep and goats must be officially identified. **No sheep or goat that is within 30 days of giving birth (either before or after) may be exhibited without prior approval from the Board.**

Please provide two(2) copies of the health certificate as well as two(2) copies of the B. ovis test result for each entry that you have.

**Have your veterinarian verify all requirements with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health prior to completing your health certificate(s) as requirements/restrictions are always subject to change due to special situations that arise within a particular state on short notice.**
